action of paramedic Miles to get in, recognize it was a serious situation and get him to the hospital that made the difference."

Miles said the department was on standby when the raids began. He and his partner were only a couple of blocks away when the call came through that an officer had been shot.

"We're supposed to wait, but we went in on that one because it was an officer down," he said. We didn't even think about it, we just took off. We just happened to be right there at the right time."

A firefighter and paramedic for 12 years, nine of those spent in Columbus, Miles has seen his share of emergencies,

he said. This situation, though, was the most intense he has ever experienced.

"It was the craziest thing I've ever seen in my life pulling in there," he said. "The way the guy was, though, I'm glad we did. I've been on tons of shootings, but this was really intense with the emotion of the cops and everything. This was a lot different."

Miles said Gillis had been shot in the leg, wounding a major artery. He immediately took charge of Gillis' care as his partner began treating the second wounded officer.

"If first aid hadn't been given when it was, he wouldn't have made it much longer," he said.

Miles lives with his wife, Nicole, in northeastern Pickaway County. They have a

2-year-old child and another on the way.

He said the honor from the FOP was the first award he has received for his service as a firefighter and paramedic.

"The whole family is proud, so it makes me feel good," he said. "It was a nice thing to do."

Gilbert said Gillis is now home from the hospital but still has a long recovery ahead of him. Doctors believe it may be a year before he can return to duty.

Foster was charged with two counts of attempted murder and two counts of felonious assault after shooting the officers through a door during the raid. He was again denied bail Tuesday by a Franklin County judge and remains in jail awaiting trial.

"Some park districts have paid staff, but we are all volunteer," he said. "As a park district, we are still in the infancy stages, but we're working to try and secure land before it gets soaked up by everything else and there's nothing left."

The district currently holds a lease with the state of Ohio for control of 90 percent of the historic canal lands in Pickaway County, Babb said. It also controls Martha Hitler Park in Washington Township, which will be upgraded with a parking area, hopefully within the next year.

The park district meets at 7 p.m. the fourth Thursday of

each month at the Pickaway County Public Library. Meetings are open, and the public is encouraged to attend.
