



2019-01-01 to 2019-12-05








Average Daily Traffic of 3 Visitors 917 visitors to the trail this year

Metzger Preserve

The Park District received \$300,000 from a Clean Ohio Green Space Grant and purchased 52 acres just south of Ballard Park in Williamsport. This park doubles the District's parks and now has open access to Deer Creek for kayaking and canoeing as well as viewing of the unique geological features called concretions! There is a wooded walking path along Deer Creek and a short path along the border of Metzger Preserve and Ballard Park









Park Improvement Grant

The Park District gave out \$125,000 for 10 projects! Entities chose from a large grant that capped at \$25,000 or a mini grant that capped at

\$5,000. The larger grant amounts made it possible for some communities to do some large projects! These grants help local communities, townships, and non-profits create and improve parks and trails throughout Pickaway County.

Roundtown Trail Improvements!

The Park District now has a shelter house on both sides of the Roundtown Trail at Ohio Christian University and at the YMCA!
Also, there is now designated trail parking on the OCU side of the trail!









Public Education and Awareness Award

After the District and other entities got fourteen Ohio & Erie Canal features on the National Historical Registry, the Ohio History Connection honored this group with a Preservation Award! We are working with the landowners to purchase or lease Lock 31, one of the features on the National Historical Registry, to allow public access to view the historic Ohio-Erie Canal lock.

New trail signs have been added to all trails at Canal Park! A playground (with the help from Washington Elementary School), pollinator areas, and new bridges are being designed and planned! The District will be going after Clean Ohio Trail Funds and Capital monies for Bridge projects over the Scioto River and the Ohio-Erie Canal.





Richards River Trail Opening

A New Trail has been created at Canal Park!

Bill Richards graciously gave the District a 2.5 mile easement along the top of his farms dike for a new walking trail!

This trail adds a 5 mile loop to the park and gives beautiful views of the river and it's wildlife!








Paving Starting on Pickaway Trail

The District borrowed the Mammal Trunk from ODNR and displayed furs, skulls and tracks for visitors to touch and see!



Canal Days

Approximately 400 People Visited Canal Park on the 26th of September for our annual Canal Days! People enjoyed live music, food trucks, craft vendors, nature and historic displays, a cornhole tournament and live chainsawing!

The District joined Pickaway Soil and Water Conservation District at their EE Camp in July to lead the kids in assembling and decorating bluebird boxes, that were pre-constructed by our own Brian Carter.



Composting Presentation

The Park District joined with the Ross, Pickaway, Highland, Fayette County Solid Waste District to provide a composting program at the Pike County Fairgrounds.

The group of adults learned about composting, how to have a successful compost pile and different ways to compost.

The Park District set up an informational table at Southern Point's first annual Craft Bazaar.

Residents learned about parks and trails in the County and kids were able to play a matching game and make nature crowns.











Pickaway Elementary Earth Day
