



2021-01-01 to 2021-12-31





2021-01-01 to 2021-12-31





2021-01-01 to 2021-12-31







Months of the year






Average Daily Traffic of 18 Visitors 6,435 visitors for 3 months in 2021

Projects

Big Darby Creek Access

In August the District hosted the official opening for the first Public Paddler Access to Big Darby Creek. The \$51,000 project was funded by a Paddling Enhancement Grant from ODNR's Division of Watercraft.









Calamus Swamp Mangement

Pickaway County Park District signed an agreement in the late summer of 2021. This agreement allows the District to manage the trails and mowing at the park for the Columbus Audubon.





Pickleball Ball In Pickaway County

Pickaway County Pickleball Association came to the Park District and the City requesting space for pickleball courts. The group used the Friends of Pickaway Parks and Trail to raise funds to put in a new court at the City's Barthelmas Park.



Park Improvement Grant

The Park District set aside \$100,000 for the 2021 Park Improvement Grant! 7 entities received up \$10,000 for their various projects. These grants help local communities, townships, and non-profits create and improve parks and trails throughout Pickaway County.



Friends of Deercreek used their funds to add carpet at Deercreek State Park's Putt Putt course.



Wil-Der Rec Board used their funds to upgrade their swings and add mulch at Williamsport Community Park.



The Village of new Holland recieved funds to fix up their ball diamond and dugouts.



The Village of Ashville received funds to resurface their walking path at Ashville Community Park.

2021 Grant Projects



Clean Ohio Trails Grant Award

The District is pleased to report that we were awarded \$303,402 through ODNR's Clean Ohio Trails Fund. The District will use these funds to build a bridge over the Ohio-Erie Canal on the Pickaway Trail at the intersection of the trail and Canal Park.







Canal Park Expansion

The District purchased 0.3
acres from the Richard
Family to expand the
parking lot at Canal Park.
The parking lot will
increase the parking lot
from 15 spots to 36 spots
and will include two
handicap spots.









Ohio-Erie Canal Southern Decent opening

The Southern Decent Ohio-Erie Canal Heritage group celebrated the opening of the heritage trail along the canal corridor during the fall of 2021. The trail consists of 20+ places and goes through historic communities and scenic landscapes. In October, Pickaway County celebrated the trail's opening at the District's Canal Park and Lock 31 (which is on private property). The District will be working to get this lock into public ownership in the future.





2021 CITF Dupont Grant

With this years award of \$10,000 to the District went towards, spraying, burning and replanted of the Prairie at Mary Virginia Crites Hannan as well as the development of new signage.





Pickaway Trail Purchase

The District Purchased o.4 acres along the Pickaway
Trail corridor on the east side of Sisk Road that had
reverted back to private ownership before the
District purchased the rail corridor. This purchase
will allow for enough space for the future trail.

New Trails At Metzger Preserve

The Park District cut new trails through Metzger Preserve's prairie, added pollinator plantings and added new trail signs for park users.

Volunteers spent 24.5 hours cleaning invasives out of the woods and prairie.










Calamus Swamp

Join the Pickaway County Park District as we travel with the dandelions! We will read a book, make a craft and play a game all while learning about a little "weed" we call a dandelion.



This year the District hosted Group Walks once a month beginning in May and running through December at various parks around the county. These walks were specifically for those 50 years young though, all were wecomed!














Summer Reading and Library Presentations






Photo Contest
